Dedicated to Youth Development

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The last few years witnessed VYK's intensive engagement at the grass roots level in selected remote and backward areas of States like Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Maharashtra, imparting training – in partnership with regional NGOs – to farmers in improved agricultural practices and their children in agro-based industries. We also worked with rural unemployed youth to develop entrepreneurship and impart income generating skills. This has afforded to us an opportunity of getting a feel of rural India and its problems at close quarters.

At the time of Independence, 87% of India's population resided in villages. However, low agricultural productivity, increasing pressure of population leading to disguised unemployment, sub-division and fragmentation of land holdings, absence of employment opportunities

coupled with marked disparity between rural and urban infrastructure and amenities has led to migration to urban centres at an alarming rate bringing the rural ratio down to 68.7%. A section of economists has been advocating urbanisation as the panacea for alleviation of unemployment and poverty.

However, a reversal of the trend has been observed wherever rural infrastructure — road connectivity, easier access to primary and secondary education, water for irrigation and drinking, availability of power — has shown marked improvement. A case in point is the Saurashtra region of Gujarat where the diamond industry workers of Surat have brought work home to their villages in and around Bhavnagar which saw such infrastructural transformation and are enjoying a much better quality of life.

It may not be out of place to briefly mention an example of integrated rural development work being undertaken on a PPP model in the Wardha district of Maharashtra by Kamalnayan Jamnalal Bajaj Foundation the highlight of which is a dramatic improvement in the availability of water for irrigation as well as drinking through a range of innovative water conservation measures such as check dams, river-interlinking, deepening of wells, rainwater harvesting. Coupled with a wide array of income generation and self-help schemes for women and skill development programmes for the youth including IT enabled services, there are growing signs of a deceleration in urban migration. This programme has already covered over 800 of the 1000 villages of Wardha. One earnestly hopes that such PPP models are replicated in other parts of India.

The year under review witnessed an expansion of state-level activities comprising 2 and 3 day programmes designed for empowering NGOs in the entire gamut of their activities – formation, management, fund raising, leadership and communication skills etc. Additionally, region specific courses were designed to familiarise NGOs with issues such as disaster management techniques in Odisha. It is a matter of pride that many of VYK's alumni have distinguished themselves in the field of social work by establishing reputed institutions. Particular mention may be made of Dr. P. K. Sahoo and his Centre for Youth and Social Development, Bhubaneshwar, Dr. C.N.N. Raju and his Indian Foundation for Global Peace Education, Bengaluru and Dr. O.P. Dave and his Indian Institute of Social Development at Indore. These individuals and their institutions are now our close and valued mentors and collaborators in our state-level programmes for training of trainers which we acknowledge with gratitude.

I wish the VYK team a busy and productive year ahead.

Glance

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra has a unique history. In 1959, the executive committee of the Indian Assembly of Youth came to the conclusion that if youth work has to be developed in the country on scientific lines, a national youth centre should be established, which would provide, on a continuous basis, training in youth work to the workers of youth organizations. The committee also visualized the centre as an international meeting place for young people from all over the world. Since a centre of this type had to have a certain permanency, it was decided to set up an independent trust, which would command the necessary respect and support. Thus, the Indian Youth Centres Trust was set up on 10 August, 1961. With the active support of Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, a decision was taken to build a youth centre. The first phase comprising mainly the hostel and the central hall was completed and inaugurated on 22 December, 1968 by Dr. Zakir Husain, the then President of India.

In order to facilitate the smooth running of various workshops, seminars and training programmes, the Kendra provides economical boarding and lodging facilities to the members and the participants. To conduct various programmes, the Kendra also has conference and training halls.

The "Talk with Amazing Indians" programme was launched in January 2014 with an objective to provide an opportunity to interact with courageous and path breaking individuals, who, as a result of their perseverance and innovative ideas, managed to overcome all odds and made a difference in their life as well as in the society.

Since launching the programme, 9 events of Talk with Amazing Indians have been organized at VYK and off campus, where 17 Amazing Indians/Social Innovators shared their experiences. Each event saw the participation of more than 350 students, mostly from various schools, colleges and institutions and the event has reached more than 8000 youth as of now. Centre for Rural Entrepreneurship and Technical Education (CREATE), Lucknow, organized the 32nd annual JSDP from 09-12 October, 2015 at Goa with the support of Konrad Adenauer Stiftung (KAS), India. The focus of the discussion was on "Vocational and Skill Development – Impact on Youth".

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. Lars Peter Schmidt, Resident Representative to India, KAS. The programme overview was delivered by Mr. Dayanand Tandon, Chief Executive, CREATE.

28 October, 2015

On 28th October, 2015 Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK) organised a National Seminar on Gandhi Zinda Hai to commemorate the 146th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. The seminar effectively re-introduced Gandhian thoughts with its various facets to the youth from schools and universities. Various Gandhian organizations and Gandhian scholars came forward to support this noble idea of Vishwa Yuvak Kendra and relentlessly worked to give shape to the idea and design of the event.

The seminar explained the importance of Gandhian values in the current socio-political and environmental contexts. The programme was broadcasted by AIR World Service in their special programme Bharat Ki Shan, and was

aired in 40 countries.

More than 300 youth from various universities, colleges and schools actively participated in the various activities organised on the occasion. Panel discussion of scholars from various universities, talks by renowned Gandhians, debate and drawing competitions, quiz and cultural programmes were the different components of the event. Positive philosophy and willingness of the youth to follow the Gandhian path clearly reflected throughout the programme. Farmers from Wardha district of Maharashtra, Sikar district of Rajasthan and Kodinar district of Gujarat who were following the natural method of farming were specially invited on this occasion.

Address by dignitaries

In his address, Sh. Rajat Kumar Narain, Chairman, Indian Youth Centres Trust, recalled the Gandhian era. He expressed his strong faith in Gandhian values and its relevance in present time, while optimistically recalling the eruption of people's movement for the social cause and its peaceful processing in recent times.

Prof. Anand Kumar, well-known Gandhian scholar and Retd. Professor of JNU, in his keynote address, informed the youth about worldwide recognition of Gandhi for his unique ideas of truth and non-violence. He exhorted the youth to be the change they want to see in the world and asked them never to give up hope for humanity.

The Chief Guest, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabhddhe, National Vice President, BJP, in his speech expressed his deep concern over the lack of tolerance in current socio-political scenario and also expressed the need for teaching tolerance in schools, along with other values like – rashtrabhasha, swadeshi, shram-pratishta, sadagi, sacharitrata etc. He emphasized on the greatest lesson that one could learn from Gandhi's life – beauty in simplicity.

Sh. Shishir Bajaj, Managing Trustee, Indian Youth Centres Trust, shared the history of the establishment of Sevagram Ashram, Wardha and the contribution made by Sh. Jamnalal Bajaj and the Bajaj family during the freedom movement.



Smt. Tara Gandhi Bhattacharjee, grand-daughter of Mahatma Gandhi expressed her concern over the word "Gandhivad", which according to her, should have been Gandhi Ki Khoj or Gandhi Prem. While elaborating this concept she further added that people were searching for Gandhi in their truth which was why they were becoming followers of Gandhi.

Sh. Ram Bahadur Rai, renowned Hindi Journalist and Padma Shri awardee, in his valedictory speech explained that the concept of "Gandhism" was being misconstrued by sections of the society as per their convenience. He further added that there were various "kinds" of Gandhians in existence today. He stressed upon the need to imbibe the core



To commemorate the 153rd birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK) celebrated National Youth Day on 12 January, 2016. The event which was celebrated in an enthusiastic manner at VYK's Ram Krishna Bajaj Conference Hall, was attended by nearly 493 youth from various schools, colleges and representatives from 38 NGOs of Delhi-NCR.

A variety of activities like drawing and debate competitions, documentary show, cultural performances by NGOs and talks on Swami Vivekananda's ideals were organized as a part of the programme. 




Paintings of winners of the drawing competition

Training Programme on NGO Management

19-23 January, 2016

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK) organized a five-day residential training programme on NGO Management from 19 to 23 January, 2016 at its campus. The main purpose of the training programme was to train and empower participants to develop their aptitudes to operate and manage NGOs more efficiently.

Talk by Successful Social Entrepreneurs and Leaders

Programme

Training Programme on Youth and Disaster Management

09-11 September, 2015

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra's training programmes for youth have always reflected the contemporary socio-political needs and have helped devise an effective action plan for the grassroot workers, development professionals and policy makers. Focusing on the need to have community-based disaster preparedness among youth, VYK, in collaboration with Center for Youth and Social Development (CYSD), organized a 3-day training programme on Youth and Disaster Management at Bhubaneshwar, Odisha. CYSD is a 33 year-old non-government organization, working to improve the quality of lives of rural and urban poor with special emphasis on tribal community in Odisha.

The major objectives of the training programme were:

- To explore the present status of the Disaster Mitigation Teams (DMTs) and the problems faced by them in the field
- To assess the efficacy of the roles and responsibilities of the DMTs in community

- disaster management
- To develop desired skills of the participants in relation to rescue and evacuation, firstaid, shelter management, warning and information dissemination and relief and rehabilitation
- To chalk-out plan of action in the line of longterm functioning of the DMTs as well as shelter management committees and their internal coordination and external strategic linkage

Total 125 youth from 13 disaster prone districts of Odisha participated in the training programme and received in-depth knowledge from technical resource partners of the programme, namely Odisha Red Cross and OSDMA. Important sessions comprising of Disaster Contexts, its Classification and Impact, Disaster Management Act, Policies, participatory exercises on rescue operations, first aid, etc. were covered by renowned resource persons during the programme.



Training Programme on NGO Management

11-13 September, 2015

In order to enhance the capacity of NGO representatives with critical perspective and tools in the art of organizational management and development, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK), in collaboration with Indian Foundation for Global Peace Education (IFGPE), organized a 3-day training programme on NGO Management at Bengaluru, Karnataka from 11-13 September, 2015. This was the second programme in the series. It was inaugurated by Dr. K. Jairaj, IAS (Retd.), Former Additional Chief Secretary to the Govt. of Karnataka whereas Dr. W.P. Krishna, President, IFGPE presided over the function.

Total 61 participants (44 male and 17 female) participated in the training programme from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Puducherry, Tamil Nadu and Telangana.

He shared his own experience of setting up a Diagnostic Centre which was helping hundreds of patients every day.

Workshop on Grant-in-aid Schemes in Government and Corporate Sectors for NGOs

Altogether 138 participants attended the workshops and learnt the Gandhian way of moving towards peace.

Training Programme on Project Proposal Writing

13-14 March, 2016

VYK conducted a 2-day training programme on Project Proposal Writing for NGOs in collaboration with Indian Institute of Social Development (IISD), Indore on 13-14 March, 2016 at Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh. Total 64 representatives from various NGOs belonging to Indore, Ujjain, Ratlam, Dewas, Shajapur and Ashok Nagar districts participated in the programme.

The major objectives of the programme were:

- To promote and develop skills related to Project Proposal Writing among the representatives of NGOs
- To develop comprehensive skills and techniques to prepare proposal considering the local needs and requirements
- To discuss various components of project proposals

- To make NGO aware about the project planning and assessment of financial budget for grant-in aid
- To encourage NGO representatives to prepare project proposal on their own

Prominent resource persons addressed the participants on the intricacies of project proposal writing. They stressed upon having qualitative project proposals keeping in mind its presentation and effectiveness. The resource persons highlighted about the application of Logical Framework Analysis (LFA) as an integral component of proposal formulation.

The participating NGO representatives appreciated and conveyed their gratitude to VYK and IISD for organizing such an interactive, informative and useful training programme.



Computer Training Programme for Rural Youth at Wardha

March, 2016

An in-depth discussion was made between Vishwa Yuvak Kendra and Kamalnayan Jamnalal Bajaj Foundation (KJBF), Wardha, Maharashtra on the present scenario of unemployment. A combined effort was made to explore various opportunities for employment. After due deliberation over emergence of computer technology, it was decided to launch a joint Computer Training Programme at Wardha, Maharashtra, to tap into the employment potential available in the IT sector. Under this collaborative programme, 50 rural youth benefitted during the year 2015-16. The major objective of the programme was to upgrade skills and generate livelihood opportunities among rural youth. The various contents of the training programme were:

3 month long professional IT course covering modules like Tally 9.0 with Tally ERP 9, Desktop Publishing (DTP) course, Hardware Support Technician Course, Financial Accounting Basics etc.

Training in Information technology, internet, web and e-commerce, basic application of software, specialized application software, system software, communication and networking

Strategically there was an intensive focus on structured selection process to identify trainees. The mechanisms adopted for the purpose include:

- The trainees were selected based on their keen interest to learn
- Due attention was given to their backward economic status (small and marginal families)
- Final participants were selected after individual counseling

A personality development programme was also organized for the participants to orient them on the art of necessary social and interactive skills to improve their communication abilities.



Integrated Community Development Programme

Weekly Health Camp

Charitable Activities and Inclusive Sustainable Development are the core philosophies of Vishwa Yuvak Kendra. Keeping this in mind, VYK's Integrated Community Development Programme (ICDP) is totally dedicated towards socio-economic growth of the deprived, vulnerable and disadvantaged sections of the society. National Seminar on 'Social Work Practices in Health Care: Emerging Health Issues among Women'

VYK, as a part of its Institutional Partnership Development activity, supported a national seminar on "Social Work Practices in Health Care: Emerging Health Issues among Women" which was organized at Old Lecture Theater, Vardhman Mahavir Medical College & Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi, on 26-27 March, 2016.

The seminar covered a wide range of interdisciplinary discussions among 200 participants, comprising of health practitioners, academia and researchers highlighting the growing issues pertaining to social, economic, environmental and health aspects of women. The event created a national platform for professionals/NGO representatives and volunteers engaged in healthcare and social work. The event provided them an opportunity to ponder over some of the pressing problems of women.

The theme of the seminar was categorized into various aspects which were:

- Violence against Women (Abuse, Violence and Mental Health Concerns)
- Health, Hygiene and Nutrition
- Challenges in Sexual and Reproductive Health
- Health Issues of Working Women: Organized and Unorganized Sectors
- HIV/AIDS/STDs and Women
- Disability and Women's Issues
- Challenges and opportunities for promoting the Girl Child's Rights
- Women's Health and Marginalized Groups: Muslims, Dalits, Tribals
- Women's Health: State and Governance

The programme was highly appreciated for its contents, discussions and deliberation on social work practices on health issues among women by all the participants.

Internship Programme

The students from different social work universities are placed for concurrent field work under the 'Integrated Community Development Programme' organized by Vishwa Yuvak Kendra. The students are inspired to improve their understanding and ability to analyze the needs and problems of individuals, families, groups and community. They are also encouraged to develop professional attitude

during the field work to respond to human needs, secure information about community resources and services in order to utilize them effectively. Under VYK's supervision, a number of interns were trained to develop processoriented skills in working with individuals, families, group and communities with special reference to social support system.

Existing

Facilities

Ensconced in the highly secure diplomatic enclave of New Delhi, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra is a full-fledged campus within itself and comprises of accommodation facilities, conference/seminar facilities, cafeteria, library, lush lawns etc. The Kendra also provides all the necessary support services like Wi-Fi, satellite TV, photocopy, sound system and other audiovisual equipment, backed by professionally qualified and experienced support staff. The campus also has space for showcasing artwork/craft exhibits.

Accommodation

In keeping with its mandate, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra extends capacious accommodation amenities with modern conveniences to the trainees, students and NGO partners from within and outside the country. The centrally located Kendra hostel has 38 well-furnished rooms with basic modern amenities.

The Annexe building has 115 dormitory beds (5-6 beds in a room) which are mostly availed by youth groups/young students, NGOs etc. The dormitory accommodation provides a viable, inexpensive accommodation option for NGO representatives and youth workers who are often on a limited budget. Complimentary breakfast is served to all the trainees/members staying in the campus. Being located in the safest neighborhood in the capital region and having excellent commuting facilities to all transport hubs (airport, railway station, bus terminal) makes VYK one of the favorite staying options of the youth from across the country and from outside India.

The VYK campus serves as a nucleus for the promotion of national harmony and international understanding in an ambience of warmth and friendship.




Dining Hall and Youth Café

A Dining Hall serves modestly priced food to trainees and members attending conferences/ seminars and training courses. The Kendra has recently opened a "Youth Café" in the campus, which serves as a venue for our members to

congregate, entertain their guests or to pass time, individually and in small groups. Like all its other facilities, the Dining Hall and Youth Café can be used only by individual/institutional members of Vishwa Yuvak Kendra.





Auditorium and Conference Halls

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra's campus has state-of-the-art (fully air-conditioned) training halls and a large auditorium. These halls and auditorium are used to conduct in-house training programmes for grass root level NGOs on various issues related to social development. No training fees are charged from the participants, except for a very nominal registration fee from the sponsoring NGOs. VYK has venues ideally suited for all kinds of requirements, be it a small board meeting or training workshop, or be it a large gathering with up to 500 persons.

All the facilities, be it accommodation, conference hall or dining hall, are used for our training activities. When not in use for Kendra programmes, these are provided to likeminded member NGOs/individuals at highly subsidized and very nominal tariff. 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
Library

The Kendra's library, specializing on youth development and other social issues, has a collection of over 12,000 books in English and 1,000 books in Hindi on various aspects of youth and social work. VYK Library subscribes to 48 journals and receives over 100 complimentary journals, newsletters etc. regularly. Its Digital Repository has a collection of Kendra's activities and a number of documentary films on social issues. It also receives over 100 complimentary publications e.g. newsletters, annual reports and conference proceedings of various ministries, NGOs and international organiza-tions, and has exchange relation with over 20 Journals.

VYK Library is fully computerized making for

quick and easy retrieval of information. It has linkages with other libraries in Delhi and has a resource sharing and Inter-Library loan facility through Developing Library Network (DELNET), a Delhi-based network of libraries for promoting resource-sharing activities among Indian libraries. This gives research scholars an easy and quick access to the required information available in other libraries. Its Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is accessible through DELNET.

The Library Reading Room is open for reference purpose during library hours, i.e. from 9.30 AM to 5.30 PM (Monday to Saturday, excluding National Holidays).



Art Gallery

As a part of its endeavour to promote art and culture, VYK has launched the VYK Art Gallery in its campus. The gallery is provided to artists including upcoming artists, to showcase their work. The Art Gallery Space, which is fully air-

conditioned, has adequate and proper lighting and decor required for such a use and is slowly gaining recognition among the art fraternity as a viable alternative for organizing exhibitions and similar events.

Success Story: Youth Weavers of Rajasthan

Skill Development and Vocational Training Programme (SDVTP) was started by Vishwa Yuvak Kendra to enable marginalized rural youth to acquire knowledge and skills for gainful jobs or productive self-employment. The activities were implemented in four states i.e. Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Odisha. The SDVT programme was started in 2013-14 and continued up to 2014-15. More than 2000 youth were trained in 25 market driven trades in collaboration with partner NGOs and Regional Training Centers during the aforesaid period.

In the era of globalization, VYK intervened in environmentally sound practices to promote handloom based livelihoods to the community people. In order to protect the steeply degrading environment, indigenous industry forms, promotion and protection of handlooms and hand spinning is the need of the hour.

The training programme on weaving transformed the lives of deprived rural youth. The motivation and skill they got during the training made them commercially viable entrepreneurs for their sustenance.


