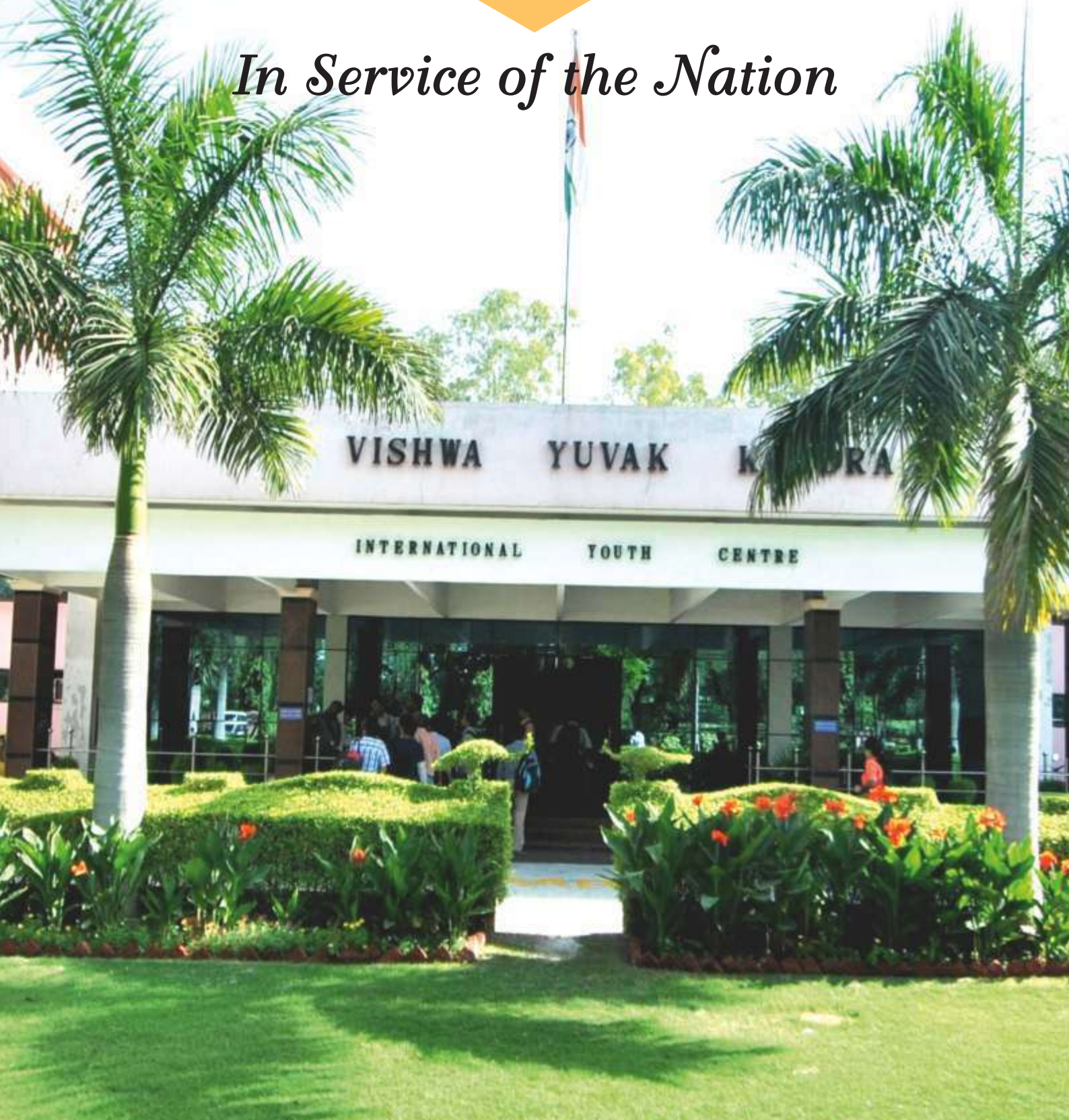

## OUR BEGINNING

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK) has a unique history. In 1959, the executive committee of the Indian Assembly of Youth came to the conclusion that if youth work has to be developed in the country on scientific lines, a national youth centre should be established, which would provide training in youth work to the workers of youth organizations on a continuous basis. The committee also visualized the centre as an international meeting place for young people from all over the world. Since a centre of this type had to have a certain permanency, it was decided to set up an independent trust, which would command the necessary respect and support. Thus, the Indian Youth Centres Trust was set up on 10 August, 1961. With the active support of Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, a decision was taken to build a youth centre named Vishwa Yuvak Kendra. The first phase comprised of mainly the hostel and the central hall was completed and inaugurated by Dr. Zakir Husain, the then President of India on 22 December, 1968.

In order to facilitate the smooth running of various workshops, seminars and training programmes, the Kendra provides economical boarding and lodging facilities to its members and the participants. To conduct various programmes, the Kendra also has conference and training halls.

## Amazing Indians/Persons Making a Difference

17 April, 2018

Mr. Popatrao Baguji Pawar, a farmer and Sarpanch of Hiware Bazar, a gram Panchayat at Ahmednagar district of Maharashtra was the key speaker. Mr. Pawar is the Executive Director of Maharashtra State Government's Programme on Model Village. He was greatly enthused with the lives and lessons learnt from some prominent people i.e. Mahatma Gandhi, Jayprakash Narayan, Anna Hazare, Vinoba Bhave and Baba Amte. He was firm to save his village from misery and isolation.

## Amazing Indians / Persons Making a Difference

18 April, 2018

Successively, another programme on Amazing Indians/Persons Making a Difference was jointly organized by Vishwa Yuvak Kendra and Deepalaya on 18 April, 2018 in Delhi. Ms. Sonal Kapoor, Founder Director, Protsahan India Foundation was the key speaker in the programme. Ms. Kapoor is also a Member of the Expert Committee on Anti-child Trafficking, Delhi Commission of Women and Member of CSO Coalition to end child marriages in India. She obtained several national and international levels accolades and awards for her commendable work to rescue and uplift a number of vulnerable children nationwide.

Ms. Kapoor achieved various relevant tasks through Protsahan India Foundation viz. rescue of 800 girls and mainstream them into formal schools, rescue of 28 girls from the forced early marriage and trained other 200 girls in entrepreneurial life skills. In addition, 11,000 girls were sensitized through documentaries and media coverage on social issues like child marriage, access to toilets and gender violence etc. Ms. Kapoor also highlighted her key achievements through the multifarious operations of Protsahan India Foundation to motivate the participants. The participants were highly motivated by the talks and interactions held with Ms. Kapoor. 260 students from various schools participated in the programme.

## Amazing Indians/ Persons Making a Difference

12 May, 2018

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra organized a day-long programme titled “Amazing Indians/ Persons Making a Difference” in association with Navjyoti India Foundation on 12 May, 2018 in Delhi. Mr. Dinesh Goswami from Prakruti Nature Club was the key motivator of the programme. He is not a highly-educated in the sense of academic degrees but his knowledge about the natural world is remarkable. Mr. Goswami served to protect the marine life of Saurashtra coastal region for over a decade. Mr. Mike Pandey, awarded in wildlife film making visited the region to shoot a film titled 'Shores of Silence – Whale Sharks in India' and met with Mr. Goswami in 1997.

Mr. Goswami shared his adventurous journey with the students in a simplified manner. His first aquatic animal rescue operation was in the range of nearly 12 nautical miles from Sutrapada. Once he found around 8.5 meters long screaming whale and a shark trapped in a fisherman's net and quickly rushed to the site to cut the net to liberate the trapped fishes and he did so. Over the years, he rescued around 25 sharks and indirectly been involved in all, 75 rescue operations at Gujarat coasts since 2004. The Prakruti Nature Club engages with dedicated daily-wage workers to the cause of wildlife conservation. 200 participants actively participated in the programme and were amazed.

### **III. Water, Sanitation and Hygiene: WASH**

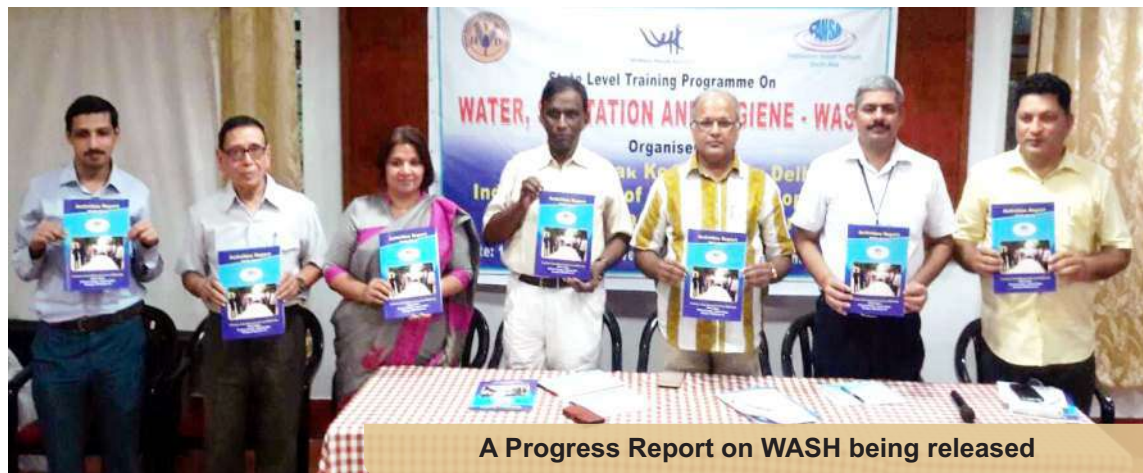

## VI. Disaster Management

Disaster is a result of a suddenly occurred calamity which seriously disrupts the normal functions of people of the society to the extent that it cannot exist without outside help. Disaster is generally defined as any tragic event stemming from events such as earthquakes, floods, catastrophic accidents, fires, or explosions. These may include future threats, and could be “natural” (geological, hydro-meteorological and biological) or “man-made” (Conflict, environmental degradation and technological hazards). The stricken community needs extraordinary efforts to cope with it, often with outside help or international aid.

Disaster Management is a crucial theme to sensitize and capacitate people in our country. The Govt. of India has established the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in Delhi, at the State and District levels offices countrywide. Vishwa Yuvak Kendra recognized the need to address the theme through training-cum-awareness programmes involving the regional NGO partners in various disaster-prone states. It is quite evident to ensure the various mechanisms of disaster management, there must be coordination among various key stakeholders engaged directly or indirectly. 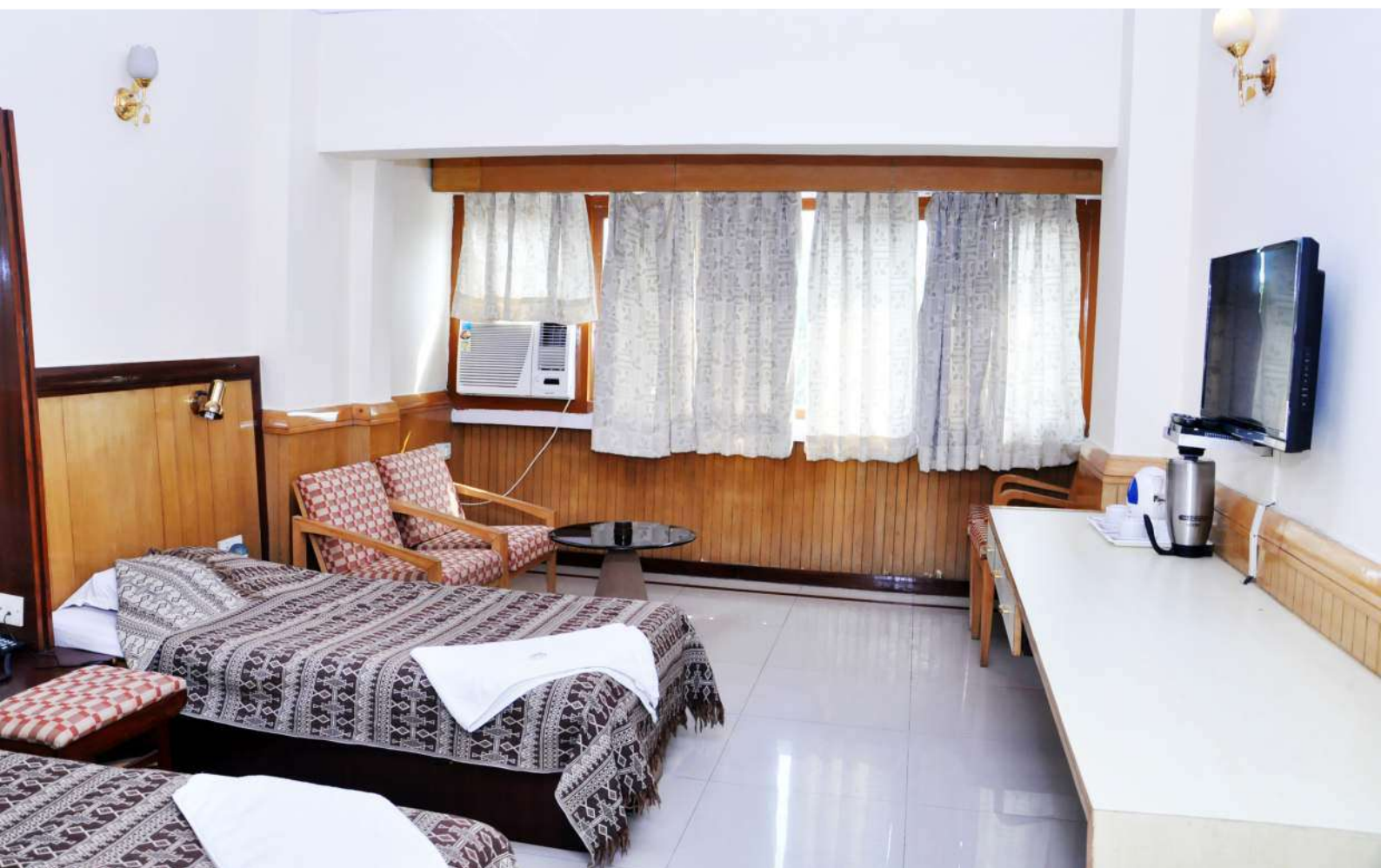
# EXISTING INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

## Accommodation

In keeping with its mandate, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra extends capacious accommodation amenities with modern conveniences to the trainees, students and NGO partners from within and outside the country. The centrally located Kendra hostel has 38 well-furnished rooms with basic modern amenities.

The Annexe building has 115 dormitory beds (5-6 beds in a room) which are mostly availed by youth groups/young students, NGOs etc. The dormitory accommodation provides a viable, inexpensive accommodation option for NGO



representatives and youth workers who are often on a limited budget. Complimentary breakfast is served to all the trainees/members staying in the campus. Being located in the safest neighborhood in the capital region and having excellent commuting facilities to all transport hubs (airport, railway station, bus terminal) makes VYK one of the favorite staying options of the youth from across the country and from outside India.

The VYK campus serves as a nucleus for the promotion of national harmony and international understanding in an ambience of warmth and friendship.



## Dining Hall and Youth Café

A Dining Hall serves modestly priced food to trainees and members attending conferences / seminars and training courses. The Kendra has recently opened a “Youth Café” in the campus, which serves as a venue for our members to congregate, entertain their guests or to pass time, individually and in small groups. Like all its other facilities, the Dining Hall and Youth Café can be used only by individual / institutional members of Vishwa Yuvak Kendra.



## Auditorium and Conference Halls

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra's campus has state-of-the-art (fully air-conditioned) training halls and a large auditorium. These halls and auditorium are used to conduct activities of in-house programme for grassroots level NGOs on various issues related to social development. No training fees are charged from the participants, except for a very nominal registration fee from the sponsoring NGOs. VYK has venues ideally suited for all kinds of requirements, be it a small board meeting or training workshop, or be it a large gathering with up to 500 persons.



All the facilities, be it accommodation, conference hall or dining hall, are used for our training activities. When not in use for Kendra programmes, these are provided to like-minded member NGOs / individuals at highly subsidized and very nominal tariff. ## Library

Since research and training on topics concerning youth is one of the objectives of Vishwa Yuvak Kendra was set up to facilitate and support these activities and also to help other developmental workers and organizations across the country in providing various kinds of specialized information.

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra Library is equipped to cater to the changing needs of individuals / organizations/ institutions and is being developed as a specialized resource centre on youth. It has an impressive collection of more than 12,000 books in English and 1000 books in Hindi on various aspects of youth and social work. The same is being updated with new books of relevance from time to time. Besides, subscribing to 48 important journals / magazines on relevant issues, it also receives over 100 complimentary publications e.g. newsletter, annual reports and conference proceedings of various ministries, NGOs and international organizations.



VYK Library is fully computerized, enables is quick and easy retrieval of information. It has linkages with other libraries in Delhi and across the country and has a resource sharing and Inter Library Loan facility through Developing Library Network (DELNET), a Delhi-based network of libraries for promoting resource-sharing activities among Indian libraries. This gives research scholars an easy and quick access to the required information available in other libraries. Its Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is accessible through DELNET. The member organizations of DELNET can search the library database online. The library database and our publication is available online through our own website for easy and free access to all. The Library is open to students, research scholars, volunteers and other visitors. It provides a variety of specialized services to individuals and organizations involved in research and training on youth. The library is open for reference purpose during library hours, i.e. from 9.30 am to 5.30 pm (Monday to Saturday, excluding National Holidays).

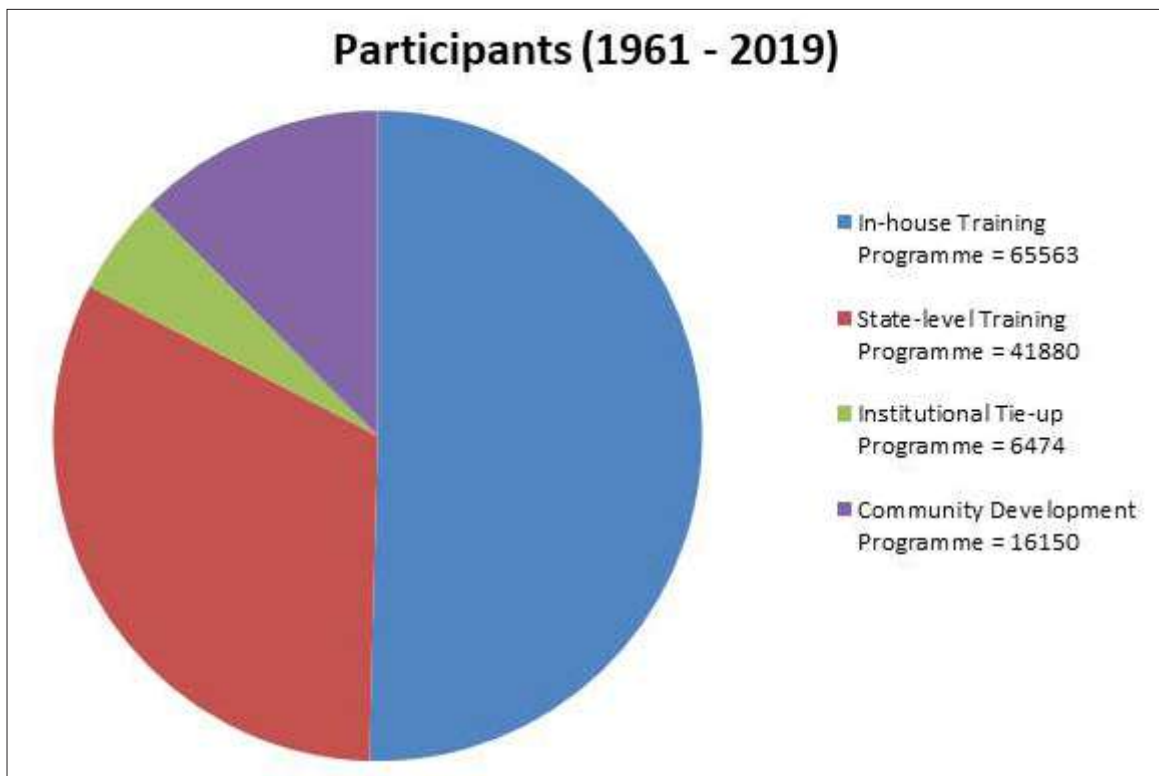
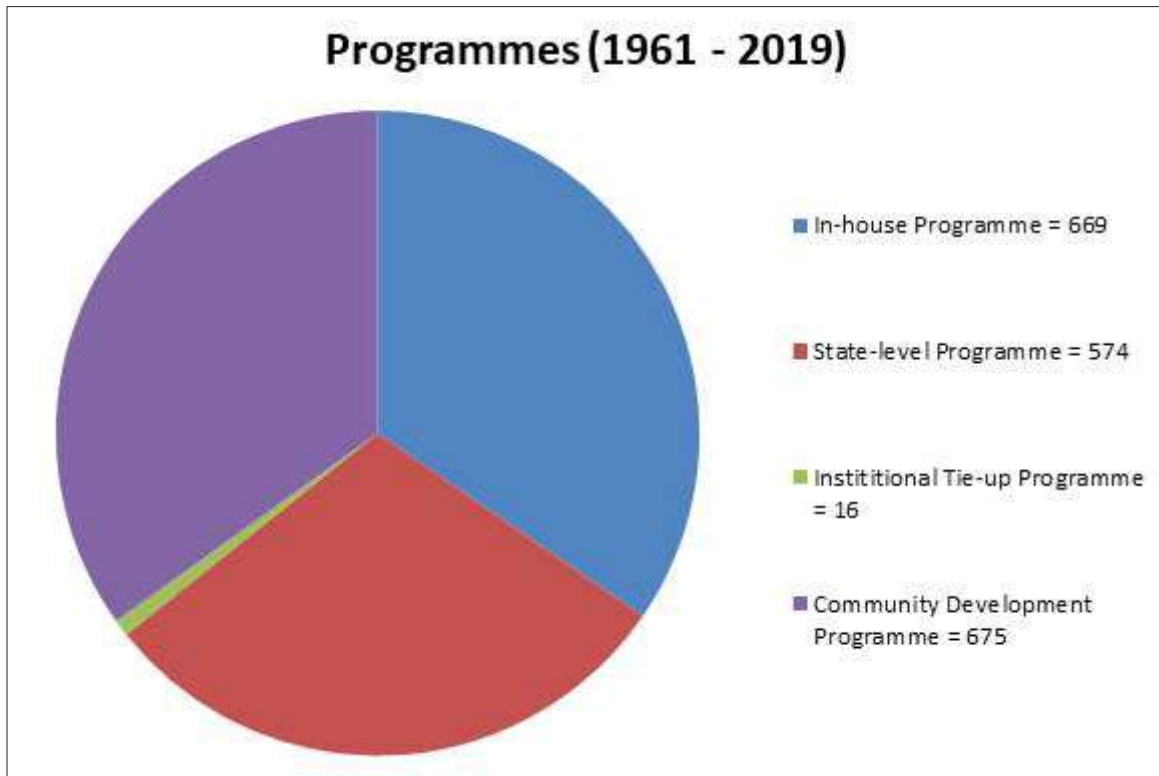
