Training on Agro-Entrepreneurship Development

4-6 July 2023

India, being predominantly agrarian, relies heavily on its agricultural and allied sectors, with approximately 70% of its population residing in rural areas, deriving their livelihoods from agriculture. Traditionally, agriculture in India was perceived as a low-tech industry, characterized by numerous small family farms that focused primarily on incremental improvements rather than embracing novel approaches. However, the past decade has witnessed a significant transformation in this landscape, driven by economic liberalization, evolving agricultural markets, and a rapidly changing society.

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra took a significant step towards empowering farmers by organizing a three-day training program in collaboration with the IRDRP Trust and Gramium, held at KVK, Puducherry. The primary goal of this training initiative was to sensitize and raise awareness among farmers, especially those who had limited exposure to new agricultural technologies and

interventions. Hon'ble Shri Djeacoumar, Minister for Agriculture, Government of Puducherry, and Hon'ble Shri AK. Sai J Saravanan Kumar, Minister for Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs, DRDA were the guests of honour.

The training sessions were not only informative but also practical, as participants were introduced to cutting-edge technologies such as drone technology and solar technology. They learned how these technologies could be applied in various aspects of agriculture, including seeding, weeding identification, and irrigation. The hands-on demonstrations provided valuable insights into how these innovations could revolutionize farming practices.

It was heartening to note that over 80 participants benefited from this program, gaining valuable knowledge and skills that have the potential to enhance their agricultural practices and improve their livelihoods.

Awareness Program on Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse

13 July 2023

Child Sexual Abuse is a grave societal issue that demands unwavering attention and concerted efforts to protect one of the most vulnerable members of our community – our children. It is not only a violation of their rights but also has profound and lasting effects on their physical, emotional, and psychological well-being. In recognition of the urgent need to address this issue, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, in collaboration with India is Calling Youth, organized an awareness program in

the heart of Kusumpur Pahari, New Delhi. The main objective of the awareness was to provide children with age-appropriate information about what constitutes appropriate and inappropriate physical contact and empower them by providing them with the knowledge and skills to recognize and respond to uncomfortable or abusive situations. Nearly 50 children attended the sensitization programme and gained knowledge from the same.



Special Health camp (Reproductive tract infections)

20 & 27 July 2023

Reproductive Tract Infections (RTIs) in females represent a significant global public health concern, impacting women across age groups, socioeconomic strata, and geographical boundaries. RTIs encompass a diverse spectrum of infections affecting various components of the female reproductive system, including the vagina, cervix, uterus, fallopian tubes, and ovaries. Left untreated, these infections can lead to severe health consequences, underscoring the importance of awareness, prevention, and early detection in women's healthcare.

To address this pressing issue, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra organized one-day specialized health camps in the Bhaiyaram Camp & Vivekanand Camp New Delhi on 20 and 27 July 2023 respectively. The events were meticulously coordinated and witnessed active participation from community members, healthcare professionals, and dedicated volunteers from Vishwa Yuvak Kendra. VYK volunteer team diligently engaged

with the community, conducting door-to-door visits in the camp area to identify potential participants based on preliminary symptoms. This proactive approach ensured the representation of women from all corners of the community in the health camp.

Dr. Prabhajot Kaur, a highly committed and experienced medical practitioner, led the health camp. She conducted a comprehensive orientation for the volunteers, imparting knowledge about Reproductive Tract Infections, treatment options, and guidelines for the proper use of prescribed medications. Dr. Kaur also provided individual consultations to each patient, conducting thorough assessments to diagnose and address their specific concerns.

The success of the health camps were greatly amplified by the active engagement of the community members from Bhaiya Ram Camp and Vivekanand Camp. A total of 132 participants attended both the camps and got benefited.

Training on NGO Management, Governance and its Compliance

27-28 July 2023

Promoting transparent decision-making, accountability, and ethical practices are the pillars of a well-structured governance framework within NGOs. These principles not only strengthen the organization but also foster trust among stakeholders, donors, and beneficiaries, nurturing long-term partnerships that are essential to support the NGO's mission. In pursuit of this objective, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, in partnership with the Federation of Voluntary Organizations for Rural and Urban Development- Karnataka (FEVOURD-K) organized a two-day State Level NGO Capacity Building Workshop on "NGO Governance, Management, and Sustainability" at Kalaburagi, Karnataka, on 27th and 28th July 2023.

The main objective of the training was to enhance governance practices, effective resource management, promote the concept of ethical leadership and to popularize networking and collaboration among NGOs. The workshop witnessed enthusiastic participation from a diverse range of NGOs. Renowned experts and practitioners in the field of NGO governance and management conducted sessions and workshops. Their wealth of experience and insights provided participants with practical guidance and solutions that they could implement within their respective organizations. A total of 136 participants from 21 districts of Karnataka attended the training and learnt about the various aspects of NGO management.

Health Camp on WASH & Menstrual Hygiene

28 July 2023

Water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) form the foundation of public health and well-being, impacting various aspects of human life. Among the many critical connections, WASH plays a pivotal role in menstrual hygiene management for women and girls.

In response to the challenges faced by deprived sections of the society in practicing safe menstrual hygiene methods, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, in collaboration with India is Calling Youth and the Freshwater Action Network South Asia (FANSA), organized a WASH and Menstrual Hygiene Awareness Camp in Sarvodaya Vidyalaya Senior Secondary School, Vasant Vihar, New Delhi.

The main objective of the camp was to raise awareness among students, teachers, and the broader community about the critical connection between WASH and menstrual hygiene and the impact on the lives of women and girls, empower participants with knowledge about proper menstrual hygiene practices, dispelling myths and promoting a stigma-free environment, and foster a sense of community involvement in addressing WASH and menstrual hygiene issues, encouraging collective action. 200 students attended the awareness generation programme and learnt about the theme.

39th Joint Staff Development Programme 2023

10-13 August 2023

In India, where more than 700 million people live in areas experiencing high water stress, the challenges of climate change only exacerbate the situation. As climate change disrupts weather patterns, water availability becomes increasingly unpredictable, and the frequency of extreme events such as flooding and drought rises. These events not only strain water resources but also affect energy production and delivery facilities, causing supply disruptions and impacting critical infrastructure dependent on a stable energy supply. Furthermore, national demands for both water and energy are projected to surge significantly in the coming decades, adding to the complexity of these challenges.

Recognizing the imperative to address these interlinkages between water, energy, climate action, and their contributions to achieving climate-smart

goals, the JSDP Partners network and India Office of KAS collaborated to advance knowledge on water and energy as integral components of climate action and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The 39th annual Joint Staff Development Programme (JSDP) focused on developing a sustainable network on SDG6 (Clean Water and Sanitation) and SDG7 (Affordable and Clean Energy) interlinkages, engaging stakeholders from all states, regions, and constituencies.

The workshop aimed to facilitate the exchange of experiences and best practices related to integrated approaches for water and energy in climate change mitigation and adaptation, as well as in promoting SDGs. 50 participants from different organisations of JSDP partner network actively participated in the programme.

Exposure-cum-Capacity Building Training Program on Agro-Entrepreneurship and Water Resource Management

18-22 August & 22-26 Sept. 2023

In recent years, the agricultural landscape has undergone significant transformations due to factors such as climate change, urbanization, and technological advancements. These changes have necessitated a shift towards more sustainable and efficient agricultural practices, particularly in the domains of agro-entrepreneurship and water resource management.

Recognizing the importance of equipping individuals with the knowledge and skills to navigate these challenges, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, in collaboration with Bajaj Foundation, organized two Exposure cum

Capacity Building Training Programmes on Agro-entrepreneurship & Water Resource Management for NGO representatives from all across the country. The first batch visited Wardha during 18-22 August 2023 while the second batch visited during 22-26 September 2023.

The Exposure cum Capacity Building Training Programme on Agro-entrepreneurship & Water Resource Management aimed to achieve the following objectives:

- To provide participants with up-to-date knowledge

and insights into sustainable agricultural practices, agro-entrepreneurship, and water resource.

- To equip participants with practical skills, tools, and techniques necessary to implement sustainable agricultural practices and manage water resources effectively.
- To strengthen the capacity of individuals and communities to adapt to changing agricultural landscapes and make informed decisions for sustainable farming and water utilization.
- To foster innovation in agriculture and water management, encouraging participants to explore creative solutions to contemporary challenges.

The events were organized at Sevagram Ashram Pratishtan in Maharashtra. The first programme was inaugurated by Chief Guest Dr. Ashutosh A. Murkute, Director of Mahatma Gandhi Institute for Rural Industrialization (MGIRI) while Dr. Pankaj Bhojar, Hon. MLA, Wardha, was the Chief Guest of the second programme. Shri Haribhai Mori, President-CSR, Bajaj Group was present on both the occasions.

Apart from discussing on the theme and watching presentation of the exemplary work being done in Wardha on agriculture promotion and water harvesting including water rejuvenation, the participants visited

Training on Disaster Management

11-13 Sept. 2023

It has been observed that disasters – natural as well as manmade – have been increasing in frequency over the past few years. It is crucial for all individuals directly or indirectly affected by the impacts of disasters to understand their causes and consequences and to be adequately prepared to build resilience against such events.

With this objective in mind, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK), in collaboration with Cosmic Community Center (A part of United Religions Initiative (URI)) and Voluntary Action for Integrated Global Awareness and Innovation (VAIGAI) Trust, initiated a dialogue on this topic by way of a 3-day training programme on Disaster Management. The intention was to provide awareness

on related subjects with the expertise of professionals in the field and in cooperation with relevant entities such as the State Disaster Management Authority, Agricultural University, like-minded NGOs, and more.

The entire training program was structured around a dynamic learning approach, which encompassed a diverse range of activities including interactive learning sessions, hands-on practical exercises, and enlightening field visits. Participants engaged in immersive sessions that combined theoretical knowledge with real-world applications, fostering a deeper understanding of disaster management concepts and practices. Nearly 70 participants from across the state participated in the event.

Project Sashakt-2023: NGO Capacity Building Training on Empowering Institutions and Professionals through Enhanced Knowledge on Skill Development

Module 1: Ecosystem of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship in India

11-15 Sept. 2023

India's demographic transition is poised at a crucial juncture – presenting either a monumental opportunity or a significant concern depending on how its vast workforce is utilized. The growth and sustainability of any nation depend on skills and knowledge, yet, unfortunately, India lags behind in providing skill training compared to other countries. To increase India's national and international competitiveness, technical and vocational education must form the foundation for skill education in the country.

The skill gap is a major concern in India, with many graduates and job seekers lacking the necessary skills to meet the demands of the job market. Skill development

can help bridge this gap and make individuals job-ready. NGOs play a vital role in skill development, especially in marginalized and rural communities, where government initiatives and private sector involvement are limited. However, many NGOs may not have a complete understanding of the various aspects of skill development, such as the current policies, schemes, best practices, and the overall skill ecosystem. Therefore, there is a need to train NGO representatives on understanding skill development to enable them to design and implement effective training programs.

To address the above issues, Vishwa Yuvak Kendra with the support of Bosch India Foundation, organized

Project Sashakt – a two-module training series aimed to provide quality training to NGO representatives on various aspects of skill development programs. The first module of the programme was conducted from 11-15 September 2023 with the aim of providing an overview of the current policies, schemes, and initiatives related to skill development in India, discussing best practices in designing and implementing effective skill development programs, including content development, training methodologies, assessment methods, and the importance of soft and life skills, understanding

of the mechanism of impact assessment process of skill development initiatives. This training program included a combination of lectures, case studies, group discussions, and practical exercises. Experts in the field of skill development shared their experiences and insights. The training program was divided into multiple sessions, covering various aspects and overview of skill ecosystem/skill development and entrepreneurship promotion, etc., and was held over a period of five days. A total of 54 participants from 13 states participated in this module.
