1960's

Foundation & Early Years

1959–1961: The idea of a national youth centre emerged from the Indian Assembly of Youth in 1959.

10 August 1961: Indian Youth Centres Trust was officially established, launching VYK with active support from Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru. Former PM Morarji Desai served as Founder Chairman, and Ramkrishna Bajaj became Managing Trustee.

1970's

International Outreach

1972:VYK conducted a three-month training programme for youth workers from Western Samoa, in collaboration with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), as part of its international capacity building efforts.

1980–1990's

Consolidation and National Programmes

This period was foundational for launching ongoing programmes in youth training, leadership, entrepreneurship, agriculture, women empowerment, and community development, thus setting the base for later projects.

2000's

Expansion of Programmes & Community Projects

Introduction of several initiatives such as ICDP (Integrated Community Development Programme) and various youth engagement projects, reflecting deeper commitment to rural and urban development.

2010's

Diverse Projects & Digital Initiatives

Launch of various flagship programmes including Aahvaan, Samarthya Pariyojana, Nanhi Pahal, CREDILA, Saksham, and Project LEAD, alongside expansion in digital learning with webinars and e-certificate courses to strengthen NGO capacity.

Since then, VYK has served as a dynamic space for training, seminars, workshops, and youth-led initiatives. With accessible boarding, lodging, and modern training facilities, the Kendra continues to be a catalyst for youth-led social transformation across India and beyond.

Vision and Objectives IYCT

Vision

To promote the interests and all-round welfare of Indian Youth and to work in cooperation with the Youth Organisations of India and other countries for the welfare of Indian as well as International Youth in general, to bring together and coordinate the activities of and to provide a medium for the exchange of information about the activities, objects and experience of Youth Organisations.

The objective of the Trust are as follows:

- To establish, maintain and conduct one or more National or International Youth Centres at suitable centres in India for promoting international understanding and cooperation and developing youth leadership;
- Each such Youth Centre may be multi-purpose in character functioning as a model youth centre for intellectual and recreational services to youth; a coordinating agency for youth organisations; a centre for building up youth leadership through a variety of programmes; and a counselling bureau to advise on various problems confronting youth;
- For the benefit of foreign students and youth delegations as well as individuals visiting India, the Youth Centre may provide hostel facilities, it may serve as an information centre, and provide them with opportunity for coming in close contact with their counterparts in India and for studying India's efforts to achieve progress through democratic methods;
- The hostel facilities at the Youth Centres shall be available to students or other persons on payment of such charges as the Trustees may decide from time to time;
- The Centre may also sponsor programmes for bilateral exchange of youth leaders, young workers and students with a view to better National Integration and international understanding and cooperation;
- The Trustees may join, contribute to, or assist financially or otherwise, any other institutions with similar objects to carry out or implement any of the objects of this Trust.

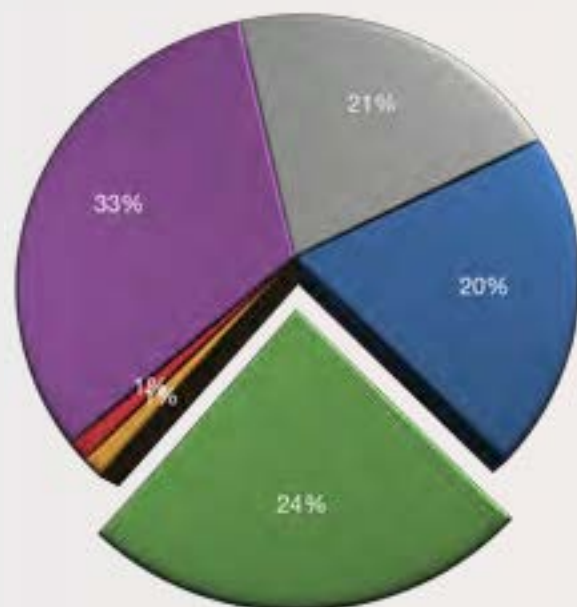

Our Mission in Action

- 1. In-house Programmes** are held at the VYK campus in New Delhi. These programmes are structured residential workshops or training sessions designed for youth leaders, educators, NGO personnel, and volunteers. These programmes focus on personal development, leadership, entrepreneurship, youth work, and thematic skills. The residential nature allows for deeper engagement, peer learning, and holistic development in a structured and supportive environment.
- 2. State Level Programmes** are organized in partnership with state governments, universities, civil society networks, and local institutions. These are large-scale interventions, often in the form of seminars, training camps, consultations, and youth conventions, targeting state specific challenges. They aim to create platforms for policy dialogue, capacity building, and innovation exchange at the state level while aligning with national youth development goals.
- 3. Institutional Tie-up Programmes** are conducted in schools, colleges, and training institutes to sensitize and educate young people on key social issues such as mental health, gender equality, WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene), life skills, and environmental sustainability. These are usually one-day or short-term outreach activities designed to empower students and faculty with practical knowledge, promote critical thinking, and encourage participatory learning through workshops, seminars, and interactive sessions.
- 4. Integrated Community Development Programmes (ICDP)** involve direct engagement with community-based organizations and NGOs. These initiatives focus on marginalized populations, particularly in rural or urban-slum settings, and address issues such as livelihood, sanitation, gender justice, youth mobilization, and community resilience. They emphasize participatory methods to ensure sustainability and ownership of development outcomes.

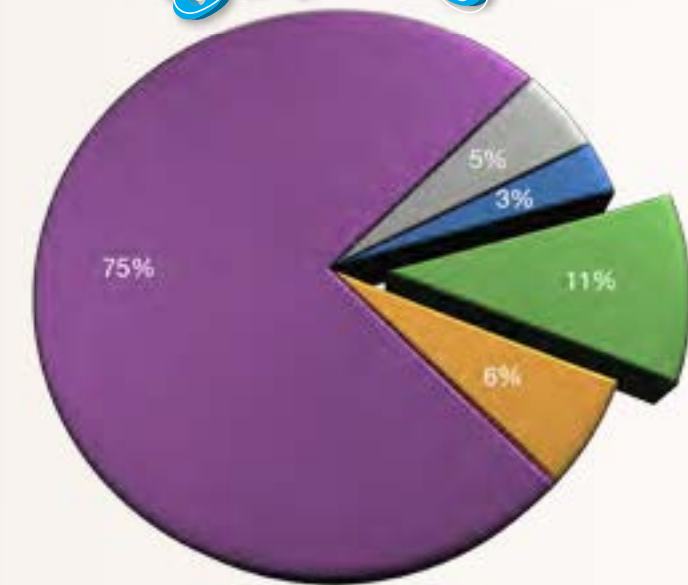

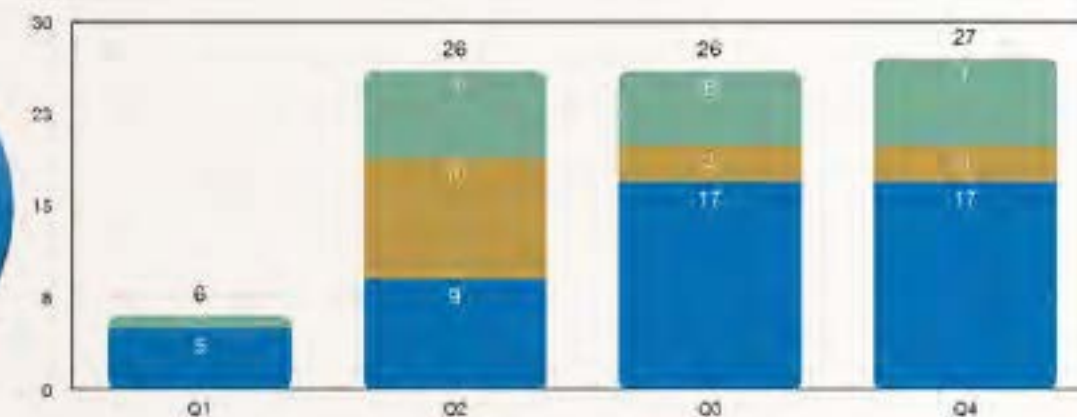
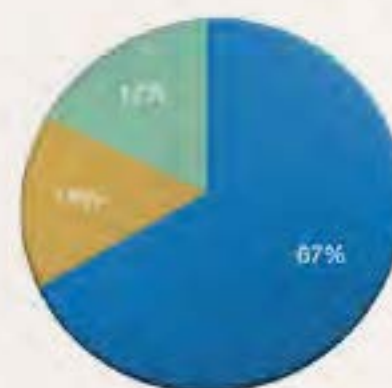

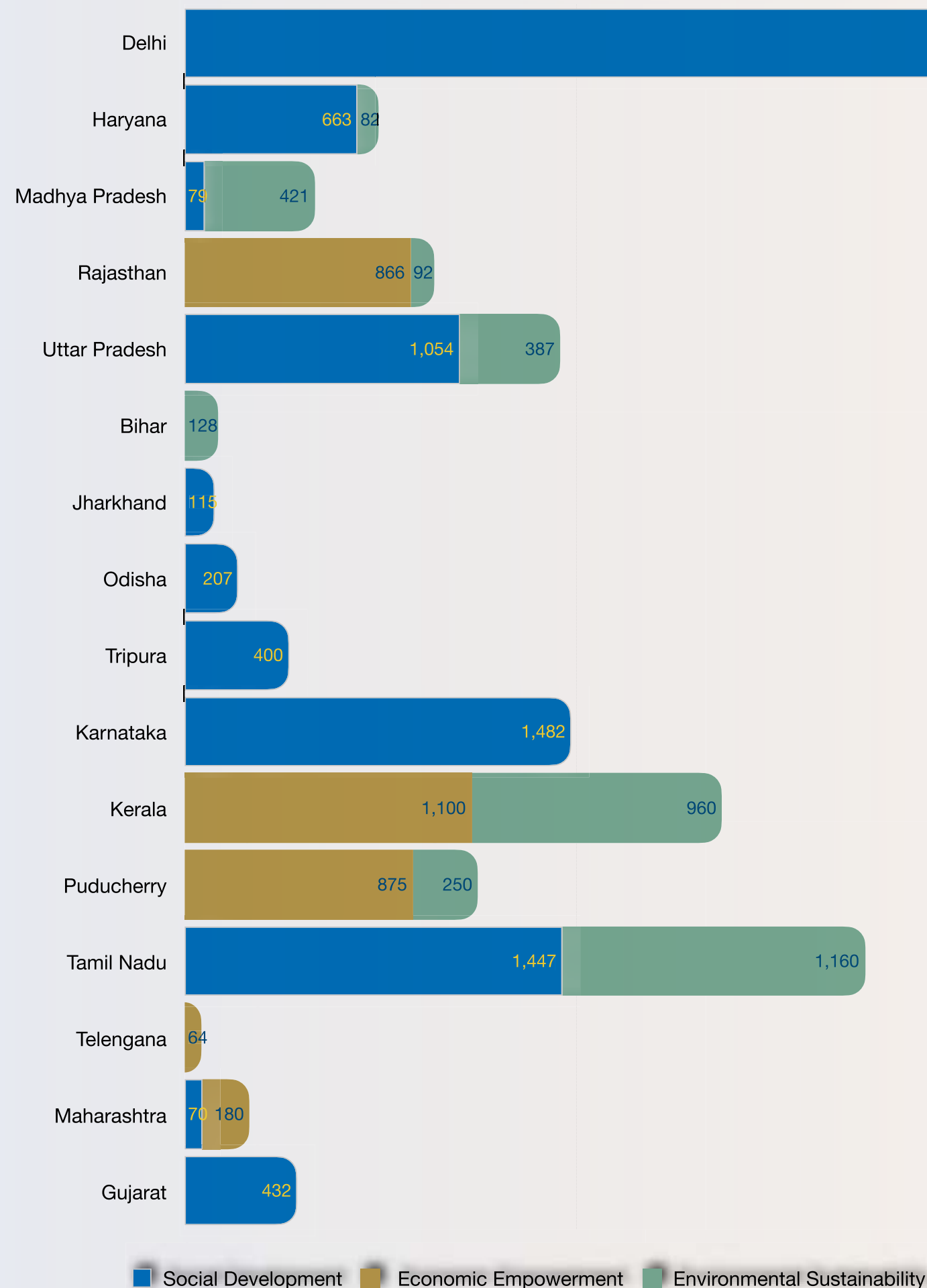
PARTICIPANT DISTRIBUTION

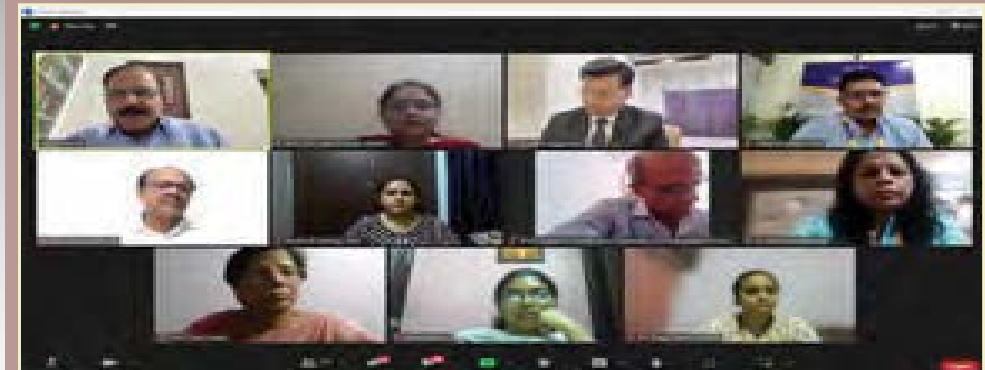

Social Development

Fostering inclusion, equity, and well-being across communities

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK) has undertaken extensive social development programs aimed at empowering communities and fostering inclusion. Key interventions included life skills development, menstrual hygiene awareness, personal and reproductive health camps, gender sensitization, youth mental health sessions, and educational exposure visits. These initiatives collectively promoted SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 4 (Quality Education), and SDG 5 (Gender Equality).

From organizing events like International Women's Day to seminars on drug de-addiction and youth leadership, VYK has consistently addressed the holistic needs of youth and marginalized populations. PM Narendra Modi has rightly said, 'Empowered youth are the builders of a strong and self-reliant India.' VYK's socially rooted actions resonate with this national call for empowerment.

CONCLAVES AND CONFERENCES

1 Youth Empowerment Conclave 2024 Stakeholders Engagement for Transformative Development

Date: 9-10 August 2024 | Venue: Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, New Delhi

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra organized a two-day Youth Empowerment Conclave, bringing together 220 youth, experts, academicians, and policymakers to address critical challenges facing India's young population. The event focused on key issues such as unemployment, skill development, education access, and youth representation in decision-making.

Inaugurated by Padma Shri Dr. J.S. Rajput and other dignitaries, the conclave featured keynote sessions, panel discussions, and interactive activities. Experts from institutions like AIIMS, Delhi University, Amity University, and NYKS (Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan) shared insights on health, entrepreneurship, policy reform, and inclusive education.

Participants engaged in collaborative group exercises and presented youth-led solutions to social and economic challenges. Themes of digital literacy, mental well-being, civic engagement, and entrepreneurial support were central to the discussions.

The closing session was addressed with closing remarks by Padma Shri Ram Bahadur Rai, Chairman, IGNCA and Dr. Rashmi Singh, Commissioner/Secretary, Hospitality and Protocol & Principal Resident Commissioner, J&K, Govt. of India. The conclave concluded with a call to action for multisectoral collaboration to equip youth with the tools, platforms, and confidence to lead India's future transformation.

2 12th Indian Social Work Conference

24-26 October 2024 | Venue: BPS Mahila Vishwavidyalaya, Sonipat, Haryana

The 12th Indian Social Work Conference, organized by BPSMV (BPS Mahila Vishwavidyalaya) and NAPSWI (National Association of Professional Social Workers in India), focused on Women Empowerment and Well-being: Social Work Response. With participation from 363 delegates across 16 states and 3 union territories, the event featured 21 parallel sessions, 3 plenaries, and 6 workshops. Over 189 research papers were presented.

The conference addressed gender equality, education, health, economic participation, legal rights, and policy interventions. Keynote speakers, including Dr. Sharanjeet Kaur and Prof. Neelam Sukhrmani, highlighted systemic gender disparities and proposed actionable strategies.

The conference concluded with recommendations on improving access to resources, enhancing legal protections, increasing women's leadership, and fostering public awareness. It emphasized integrating gender perspectives into education and policy, strengthening crisis support systems, and mobilizing NGOs and community stakeholders.

The event successfully fostered dialogue, collaboration, and practical resolutions to empower women and promote inclusive development through social work.

NGO-CSR Conclave Aahvaan 2nd Edition

Date: 10–11 February 2025 | Venue: Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, New Delhi

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra organized the 2nd Edition of NGO-CSR Conclave Aahvaan and brought together a dynamic spectrum of stakeholders from the corporate, development, academic, and policy sectors. The event focused on enhancing partnerships, reimagining CSR strategy, and strengthening NGO engagement in India's journey toward Viksit Bharat 2047.

Spanning six thematic panels and high-level keynote sessions, Aahvaan deliberated on CSR evolution, stakeholder collaboration, technology for social good, and the roadmap for SDG alignment. The conclave emphasized the need for strategic, accountable, and inclusive CSR practices, with NGOs positioned as key enablers in translating vision into grassroots impact.

With over 305 participants, delegates and speakers from 23 states across India, Aahvaan 2.0 served as a powerful platform for dialogue, capacity-building, and co-creation—reinforcing VYK's commitment to nation-building through convergence and innovation.

Dates: 24–25 February 2025 | Venue: Deoghar, Jharkhand

Training on Sustainable Development and Voluntary Organisations convened over two impactful days, bringing together 115 community leaders, youth, and experts to advance women's empowerment and security. The workshop opened with an inspirational inauguration and a vibrant welcome performance by adolescent girls, symbolizing grassroots strength.

Day One featured sessions on sustainable development, gender-based challenges, legal frameworks, and the role of technology in enhancing women's safety. Esteemed speakers, including district officials and policy experts, emphasized collective responsibility and the urgent need for grassroots action toward gender equality.

On Day Two, the dialogue deepened through interactive activities: a puppet show addressing digital gender discrimination, a youth-led panel on security, and the inspiring journey of a changemaker in leadership. Discussions culminated in developing community-driven safety models and strategic advocacy for women's rights. Suraksha Samvad successfully galvanized participants to implement actionable steps toward a safer, more equitable society for all women.

5 The South India CSR-CSO Conclave

4-5 March 2025 | Venue: Bengaluru, Karnataka

The South India CSR-CSO Conclave, was jointly organized by Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, Fevourd-K and MSME & Startups Forum - Bharat Karnataka.

The event brought together over 230 participants including CSR professionals, NGO leaders, academicians, and social entrepreneurs to strengthen partnerships between corporate and civil society sectors. Key sessions focused on aligning CSR initiatives with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), effective proposal writing, and impact measurement.

Experts highlighted best practices in corporate responsibility, capacity building, and community engagement. Panel discussions encouraged mutual understanding between CSR funders and grassroots organizations, emphasizing transparency, compliance, and sustainability.

The conclave also featured a startup showcase and group work sessions for practical knowledge exchange. The event concluded with actionable resolutions to foster long-term CSR-CSO collaborations for inclusive development, particularly in the domains of health, education, environment, and livelihoods across South India.

SEMINARS AND SYMPOSIUMS

1 Seminar on Mental Health and Well-Being

Date: 22 May 2024 | Venue: Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, New Delhi

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, in collaboration with IHBAS (Institute of Human Behaviour and Allied Sciences), organized a daylong seminar titled "Mental Health and Well-Being: Radiant Mind, Resilient Heart". The event engaged 205 youth in insightful discussions on mental health challenges, awareness, and coping strategies.

Key dignitaries, including experts from IHBAS and Brahma Kumaris, addressed topics such as the importance of positive thinking, emotional regulation, the mind-body connection, and the role of spirituality in mental well-being.

Technical sessions explored mental disorders, psychosocial influences, and tools for self awareness and emotional balance. Speakers emphasized building resilience, promoting self esteem, and encouraging help-seeking behavior.

Interactive discussions, practical strategies, and motivational talks provided participants with clarity, confidence, and actionable steps to safeguard their mental health.

The seminar successfully fostered awareness, broke stigmas, and promoted a culture of empathy and psychological well-being among youth. Certificates were distributed to all participants.

SEMINARS AND SYMPOSIUMS

2 National Symposium on Disability and Inclusion

Date: 7 August 2024 | Venue: Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, New Delhi

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, in collaboration with Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal (RMKM), Delhi School of Social Work, and Central University of Rajasthan, hosted a National Symposium on “Disability and Inclusion: A Way Forward.” The event brought together 115 government officials, experts, NGOs, and persons with disabilities to address systemic barriers and propose inclusive strategies.

Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, emphasized gaps in implementing the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. Key sessions focused on challenges in education, employment, policy implementation, and societal attitudes.

Panels featured insights on inclusive education under NEP 2020, corporate and NGO engagement, and disability rights advocacy. Personal stories and experiences were shared by individuals with disabilities highlighting the need for structural reforms.

The symposium concluded with actionable recommendations, including digital literacy, infrastructure upgrades, and sensitization of educators and communities. It served as a platform to advance disability inclusion through collective dialogue and commitment.

3 Seminar on Mental Health and Drug De-addiction

Date: 4 December 2024 | Venue: Yaduvanshi Shiksha Niketan, Mahendragarh, Haryana

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK), in collaboration with Gramin Vikas Mandal, organized a seminar on Mental Health and Drug De-addiction to raise awareness among rural youth about emotional well-being and substance abuse prevention.

Ms. Mukta Bhardwaj (Program Officer, VYK) emphasized the rising relevance of mental health in rural settings due to social media and addiction trends. Speakers included Prof. Payal Kanwar Chandel (CUH), Dr. Chandrabhan (Clinical Psychologist), and Dr. B.P. Yadav (Homeopathy Counselor), who addressed the psychological impact of addiction, symptoms of mental disorders, and treatment pathways.

Interactive sessions helped students understand practical strategies to manage stress, anxiety, and depression.

Yaduvanshi Group and Gramin Vikas Mandal appreciated the joint effort, acknowledging the event’s positive influence on students’ mental clarity and motivation.

The seminar concluded with a vote of thanks and memento presentations, marking a successful awareness initiative attended by over 300 students.

4 Seminar on Youth Leadership development

Date: 2 September 2024 | Venue: Kuvempu University, Shivamogga, Karnataka

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, in collaboration with Kuvempu University and Chaitanya Rural Development Society, organized a seminar on Youth Leadership Development attended by 1,155 students.

The event featured inspiring addresses by Smt. Hephsiba Rani Korlapati (IAS), industrialist Sri Nivedan Nempe, and academic leaders including Vice Chancellor Prof. Sharath Ananthamurthy. Speakers emphasized critical thinking, self-awareness, and the courage to take risks—qualities essential for leadership.

VYK’s representative highlighted their role in nurturing youth leadership towards inclusive development. Students were encouraged to draw inspiration from diverse sources, challenge assumptions, and act with confidence and social commitment.

The seminar concluded with distribution of certificates and a strong message: leadership begins with self-reflection, responsibility, and a willingness to take action for the greater good. The event successfully motivated youth to become agents of change in their communities and beyond.

5 Seminar on International Day of Persons with Disabilities

Date: 3 December 2024 | Venue: Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, New Delhi

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra organized a seminar on the occasion of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities, themed “Amplifying the Leadership of Persons with Disabilities for an Inclusive and Sustainable Future.” The event aimed to celebrate the achievements of persons with disabilities and foster dialogue on inclusive education, employment, and leadership.

Keynote speaker Dr. Pawan Sinha (Professor, MIT, USA) highlighted the role of inclusive science and technology in bridging access gaps. Other dignitaries, including Mr. Ranjan Mukherjee (VSM Retired) and Dr. Ranjeet Mehta (CEO, PHDCCI), emphasized policy reform and private sector collaboration. A panel discussion moderated by Dr. Amna Mirza featured inspiring voices like Suvarna Raj, Rati Misra, and Dr. Gyanendra Kumar, who shared personal experiences and advocacy insights.

6 Seminar on Digitalization and Cyber -Security

Resource Farmer Training

Date: 5-7 August 2024 | Venue: Sikar, Rajasthan

The Vishwa Yuvak Kendra in collaboration with Bajaj Foundation conducted a three-day training program to empower 65 farmer facilitators with the Problem Posing Approach, rooted in Paulo Freire's pedagogy. The training focused on enhancing facilitation, storytelling, and mobilization skills essential for transitioning 5,000 farmers to natural farming.

Participants explored methods such as Varnamala Vidhi (Alphabetisation) and Chitrakala Vidhi (Picturisation), emphasizing interactive and reflective learning. Emphasis was placed on shifting from a traditional trainer role to that of a Sutradhar—a guide and storyteller engaging learners emotionally and intellectually.

Creative pre-facilitation work, storytelling sessions, and practical demonstrations fostered deep reflection on chemical-based farming's impacts. Each facilitator developed and presented actionable session plans for their communities.

Resource Farmer training

Date: 2-4 Sep 2024 | Venue: Sikar, Rajasthan

The three-day Facilitator Training Program aimed to empower 65 community leaders and farmers to become effective facilitators promoting natural farming.

Through interactive ice-breaking sessions, group discussions, films like Swades and Gandhi, and participatory techniques inspired by Paulo Freire's pedagogy, participants explored critical thinking, stakeholder engagement, and sustainable agricultural practices.

Activities such as couplet writing, picturisation, and role-plays helped in decoding the harmful effects of chemical farming and promoting natural alternatives. The training emphasized the role of facilitators as "Sutradhars"—guides who spark internal motivation and reflection within communities. Participants also developed session plans and IEC materials like poems and drawings to advocate for change. Recommendations included continuous practice, support from Bajaj Foundation staff, and widespread use of educational tools. The training concluded with strong commitment from participants to lead the transition towards natural farming in their respective regions.

Workshop on Developing Strategies and Approaches to CSR Partnerships

Date: 20-21 September 2024 | Venue: PDTC Warangal, Telangana

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK) and Bala Vikasa PDTC (People Development Training Centre) jointly organized a two-day national-level training workshop on "Developing Strategies and Approaches to CSR Partnerships".

2 Global Meet 2024 on Climate Resilience, Protection and Conservation

Date: 16 November 2024 | Venue: IIM Kozhikode, Kerala

1 Seminar on World Environment Day 2024

Mr. Uday Shankar Singh, CEO of VYK, shared insights on development sector challenges and the importance of sustainable, inclusive growth. Students participated actively in discussions moderated by Ms. Namrata Ajay, gaining exposure to field implementation strategies.

The session concluded with an expression of gratitude, the National Anthem, and a high tea interaction. The visit provided students with valuable insights into real-world development practices and strengthened academic-community linkages.

1 e-Certificate Course on Life Skills

Date: 15 June - 19 October 2024 | Mode: Virtual

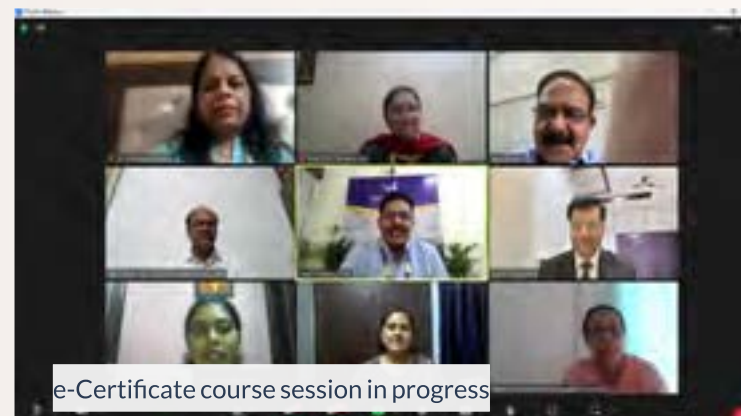
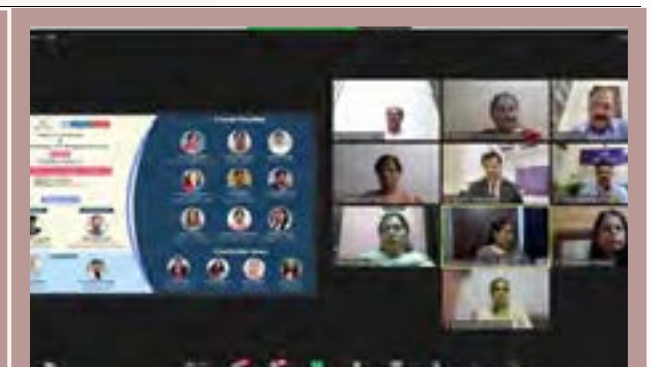
The course was conducted by Vishwa Yuvak Kendra in collaboration with School of Education, K.R.Managalam University, Gurugram. The four month free e-certificate course focussed on Life skills: enhancing knowledge on key competencies such as self-awareness, communication, empathy, critical thinking, and emotional well-being. The course included fourteen technical sessions using presentations, videos, infographics, and activities.

The initiative particularly benefited 5049 youth from NGOs, educational institutions, and community-based organizations, enhancing their psychosocial skills and resilience.

Learners who completed the course, were provided with e-certificates. The program received overwhelmingly positive feedback for its accessible format, relevant content, and practical impact. It effectively contributed to empowering individuals to navigate life's challenges and make responsible decisions.

The course enabled the participants to :

- Develop an understanding of the essential components of Life skills. Equip them with the tools to overcome obstacles, cope with adversity, and find healthy solutions to life's difficulties.
- Learn strategies for goal setting, time management, and maintaining motivation to pursue aspirations with confidence.
- Develop effective communication skills like active listening, assertiveness, and conflict resolution to navigate social situations with confidence and build meaningful relationships.
- Enhance strategic thinking, decision-Making and problem-solving skills required to lead a balanced personal and work life.



ICDP -AWARENESS PROGRAMS AND CAMPAIGNS

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK) has consistently worked towards empowering communities through knowledge-based interventions focused on health, hygiene, gender equity, and environmental responsibility. Between May 2024 and February 2025, VYK conducted a series of structured awareness programmes and campaigns across underserved urban and semi-rural settings in Delhi NCR and Madhya Pradesh. Additionally, the World Environment Day 2024 campaign engaged 36,590 people nationally through digital and on-ground outreach.

1 Life Skills and Personality Development

Date: 9 May 2024 | Venue: Vivekanand Camp, New Delhi

VYK held a community-based session focusing on emotional intelligence, critical thinking, and communication. Through interactive tools like role-play and storytelling, the initiative engaged 44 participants, nurturing self-awareness and social responsibility.

2 Menstrual Hygiene Awareness

Date: 18 September 2024 | Venue: Bhaiya Ram Camp, New Delhi

Date: 30 September 2024 | Venue: Kusumpur Pahari, New Delhi

These camps empowered 56 and 58 participants respectively with scientific, stigma-free understanding of menstruation and safe practices.

3 Gender Equality and Girl Child Empowerment (Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao)

Date: 30 August 2024 | Venue: Shankar Camp, Moti Bagh, New Delhi

The camp brought together 70 community members, using art, plays, and discussions to challenge gender norms and advocate for girls' education and delayed marriage

5 Waste Management and Environmental Sustainability

Date: 18 July 2024 | Venue: Vivekanand Camp, New Delhi

An awareness programme educated 43 participants on waste segregation and the 3Rs. Activities like paper craft using recycled waste brought sustainability concepts to life.

4 Health & Personal Hygiene Awareness

108 adolescents participated in handwashing demos and skits.

Each session not only provided knowledge but also instilled confidence, resilience, and agency among participants—particularly adolescents and women. The initiatives collectively advanced the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), especially in health (SDG 3), gender equality (SDG 5), clean water and sanitation (SDG 6), and responsible consumption (SDG 12).

ICDP - SPECIAL HEALTH CAMPS

Vishwa Yuvak Kendra (VYK), continuing its commitment to community well-being, organized a series of Special Health Camps addressing critical health issues often overlooked in marginalized communities. These camps focused on reproductive health, orthopaedic care, and dental hygiene, delivering not only clinical services but also awareness, counseling, and behavioral guidance. The camps aimed to bridge the healthcare access gap for vulnerable populations such as women, adolescents, elderly individuals, and low-income families.

1 Reproductive Health Camps – RTIs and STIs

Date: 24-25 October 2024 | **Venue:** Bhaiya Ram and Vivekanand Camp, New Delhi
Lead Resource Person: Dr. Prabhajot Kaur

These two back-to-back reproductive health camps were specifically designed to address Reproductive Tract Infections (RTIs) and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) among women and adolescent girls. Door-to-door mobilization efforts were undertaken to identify symptomatic individuals, and one-on-one medical consultations were provided to 97 participants in total. Volunteers and interns conducted myth-busting sessions and hygiene education, using a syndromic approach for diagnosis. Free medicines, counseling on contraceptive use, and stigma reduction were key outcomes. These camps helped create a safe and informed environment around women’s reproductive health.

2 Dental Health Awareness and Screening Camp

Date: 26 March 2025 | **Venue:** Vivekananda Camp, New Delhi
Lead Resource Person: Dr. Vishal Bahari (Dental & Implant Clinic), with Amity University and DSSW (Delhi School of Social Work) Interns

This special camp focused on oral health and hygiene, offering free dental check-ups to 76 participants. The programme included diagnosis of cavities, gum issues, and dental sensitivity, followed by the distribution of dental care kits (toothbrush, toothpaste, tongue cleaner). Pre-camp mobilization, awareness posters, and interactive models helped deliver critical oral care messages, such as “Swasth Daant, Swasth Jeevan.” The initiative was especially important for children and adults who otherwise lack regular dental care access.

3 Special Orthopaedic Health Camp

Date: 16 May 2024 | **Venue:** Vivekanand Camp, New Delhi
Lead Resource Person: Dr. R.K.Pandey with DSSW interns

Focusing on bone, joint, and posture-related ailments, this camp served 64 community members—many of whom were elderly or experienced chronic joint pain. Services included free consultations, BMI assessment, and distribution of medicines. Informative displays, banners, and selfie stands were used to encourage preventive care and lifestyle changes. Participants were sensitized to the importance of early diagnosis and regular physical activity in managing orthopaedic conditions. The event successfully blended medical aid with public awareness.

The Special Health Camps organized by Vishwa Yuvak Kendra reflect a proactive and inclusive approach to primary healthcare delivery in underserved areas. These interventions went beyond treatment, tackling deep-rooted stigma, misinformation, and neglect in crucial areas of health. By integrating medical services with community education, VYK empowered individuals to take ownership of their health, enhanced awareness, and laid the groundwork for long-term well-being. Encouraged by the community’s positive response, VYK plans to continue and scale such impactful initiatives across more locations, in partnership with public health professionals and academic institutions.

Interns from DSSW and colleges including Ambedkar and Aditi College facilitated the event, mobilizing the community and managing the activity efficiently. The programme officer, Mr. Rakesh Singh, along with the interns, ensured smooth coordination and adherence to rules.

The event showcased enthusiasm, unity, and competitive spirit among the youth. Matches were conducted with full participation and fair play, fostering a sense of sportsmanship.

The activity successfully encouraged community bonding, physical well-being, and leadership among adolescents, making it a meaningful and energetic engagement for all involved.

3 Heritage Festival 2024

Date: 21-27 November 2024 | Venue: Location: Swami Vivekananda Ground, Agartala, Tripura

Organized by Yuva Vikash Kendra in partnership with Vishwa Yuvak Kendra and Bajaj Foundation, the third edition of Heritage Festival brought together 400 youth for a week-long cultural, educational, and developmental celebration. Activities included peace rallies, yoga, workshops on social issues, language exchange, and an Indigenous Art & Craft Exhibition supported by NABARD, TRLM, and others. Key sessions addressed rural development, drug prevention, and sustainable living. Dignitaries, including the Hon'ble CM of Tripura and US Ambassador Eric Garcetti, lauded the youth's participation. The festival successfully promoted national integration, youth empowerment, and cultural pride.

The State-Level Job Fair for Persons with Disabilities, organized by RMKM in collaboration with VYK, aimed to foster inclusive employment and economic self-reliance among PWDs. Held in Ajmer, the event brought together 500 PWDs and 50+ employers from sectors such as hospitality, IT, education, and healthcare.

The VYK campus serves as a nucleus for the promotion of national harmony and international understanding in-an-ambience of warmth and friendship.

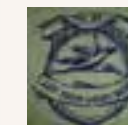
